

All the Places I've Ever Lived is part ghost story, part murder ballad, part crime thriller, and explores the themes of outsiders and difference, with a dark edge.

15-year-old Barry wakes up one day to find that his body is covered in strange, metallic lumps. Living nine miles from Sellafield nuclear plant could be an explanation for this, but, actually, something more uncanny is going on. The evening before, a girl from Barry's school, Philomena May, was brutally attacked and left in a ditch to die. Philomena's ghost visits Barry and guides them both into the future, where Barry and the ghost girl's purpose is to prevent the real-life multiple shootings carried out in the same town by rampaging taxi driver Derrick Bird. The book flicks between 1976 and 2010, and explores the effect of horrendous crimes on small communities and the way the gradual accretion of small grudges can drive a person to mass murder. Readers are calling the book a thrilling mash up of Edward Scissorhands, In Cold Blood, and Back To The Future.
